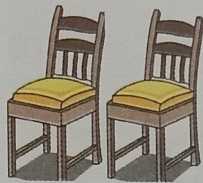
We use **these** for many things (plural) which are near and **those** for many things (plural) which are far. The arrow is for things that are far.
